The Practice of Holiness

Giving God our best through our thoughts, actions, and moments.

"Therefore, prepare your minds for action; be self-controlled; set your hope fully on the grace to be given you when Jesus Christ is revealed. But just as he who called you is holy, so be holy in all you do; for it is written: 'Be holy, because I am holy.'" I Peter 1:13-16

Last month the Camp Sentinel staff and volunteers gathered for, "Staff Summit" - a weekend training to prepare for the summer ahead. During the brainstorming session around the Lodge campfire, the staff shared about the need for "more time" with the campers and "more time" for Bible study. A beautiful shift happened. These young adults wanted more. "More" was a desire for something set apart, something Holy.

Fr. William Meninger once said, "God is calling you to great holiness. It is not something that you have to earn. Jesus already did that for you. Just accept it and run towards the Lord with open arms and an eager heart."

Financial Snapshot As Of March 31, 2024


